| Concur | <p>The overarching goal of the 2022 summer programs was to mitigate learning disruption by offering continual engagement in academic instruction, specials, and electives.</p> <p>Given the length of summer programs and student performance in math and ELA, it is important to continually communicate explicit program goals and projected outcomes to stakeholders, as well as the academic and non-academic impacts of the summer program.</p> <p>Based on the recommendations, planning for Summer 2023 included the following upgrades:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In order to support graduation requirements and the targeted focus on high school students in need of credit recovery or credit replacement, a performance data dashboard was created and sent to each high school. MCPS will continue to explore alternative registration systems that allow much more guidance to parents in order to eliminate confusion. <p>Attendance</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To ensure that Synergy explicitly captures overall summer program participation and student-level attendance, MCPS implemented a system of maintaining detailed attendance records on a daily basis for each student, capturing the number of days (full or fractional) attended, MCPS trained staff on the new procedure to ensure accurate representation of attendance information, | Implemented | 8/11/2023 |
