Explanation of School Profile Sections

There are seven sections for each MCPS school in the 2021–2022 School Safety and Security at a Glance. These are illustrated on the School Sample Page on page vii of this document. The glossary of terms includes definitions for the lists of categories and an explanation of incidents in each category.

Section 1: Number of Out-of-School Suspension Incidents

In this section, the number of suspension incidents for particular categories is reported. The number in each column represents the number of students suspended for the category. Numbers are duplicated counts, meaning a student could be counted in more than one category and/or a student could be counted more than once in the same category.

Section 2: Out-of-School Suspension Rate

This section includes the number and percentage of students suspended during the three most recent school years. These data represent an unduplicated count of students, meaning a student is counted only once, regardless of the number of times suspended.

Section 3: Reported Serious Incidents

In this section, incidents reported to the Office of Teaching, Learning, and Schools, as well as the number of incidents for which police were notified is included. Events may be reported as a serious incident if they result in or lead to any incident resulting in death or serious injury of any person on an MCPS site or while conducting MCPS business; potential or actual disruption of the planned school day; or any of the other criteria outlined in MCPS Regulation COB-RA, Reporting a Serious Incident (see page 455). Notification is dictated by several documents, including MCPS Regulation COB-RA, Reporting a Serious Incident; MCPS Regulation JFA-RA, Student Rights and Responsibilities; and the Memorandum of Understanding Between MCPS and Montgomery County Department of Police and Montgomery County State's Attorney's Office.

Section 4: Bullying Incidents

This section includes the number of bullying incidents reported and confirmed. The "Number Reported" is the number of written reports of bullying incidents (MCPS Form 230-35, *Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation Reporting Form*) submitted to a school. The "Number Confirmed" is the number of reported bullying events deemed accurate upon investigation by a school administrator.

Section 5: Drills Conducted

This section reflects the actions taken by schools to prepare students for emergency situations and those situations at a school that require declaration of some alert status.

Section 6: Safety Incidents Requiring Alert Status

This section reflects the actions taken by schools when actual incidents occur at a school or in a school's community requiring staff members and students to remain within their classrooms, within a secured area, and possibly accounted for and under supervision.

Section 7: Programs

This section includes programs offered in the school to develop the behaviors and skills that promote safe and secure school environments. School programs are determined by the Office of Student and Family Support and Engagement.
