## Lights, Camera, Literacy! High School Edition Flashback Techniques Capture Sheet

Common Cinematic Flashback Techniques:

- The scene dissolves into a flashback
- The screen includes a wavy effect during the dissolve (often accompanied with a harp or other sound effect).
- A visual match-cut of an object (zoom in/zoom out)
- An audio match-cut of a sound that starts the flashback scene. (For example, when remembering a car crash, a character might hear the sound in the present, and reflect on the past by visualizing the scene.)
- The viewer hears the audio of the flashback before it starts (sound bridge)
- The character falls asleep or daydreams into the flashback
- Colors change from present scene to flashback scene (For example, present scene may be in color, but flashback scene is black and white)
